

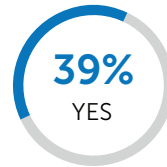

WILL THE U.S. BE BETTER PREPARED FOR ANOTHER WAVE OF COVID-19 THIS WINTER?



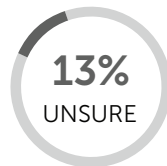
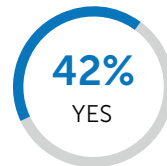
61% of clinicians are either unsure or don't believe we're better prepared for another wave of COVID-19



ARE CLINICIANS CONCERNED ABOUT HAVING ENOUGH PPE DURING ANOTHER WAVE IF COVID-19 CASES INCREASE?



55% of clinicians are unsure or concerned about having enough PPE if COVID-19 cases increase



EMPLOYMENT STATUS AMID COVID-19 CONCERNS:



In June of 2020, more than half of all respondents were from organizations who had employees either furloughed or laid off due to COVID-19



54% of clinicians' organizations were affected by furloughs or layoffs

AS OF SEPTEMBER:



24% of clinicians reported they were professionally affected at some point due to the pandemic



38% of those respondents had been hired back by the same employer



21% of them are working locum tenens

IMPACT OF THE PANDEMIC ON PATIENTS:



12% of patients lost healthcare insurance due to the pandemic



70% now say they are comfortable visiting a doctor for preventive care



74% of Americans say it would be likely for them to go to the ED

Methodology: LocumTenens.com surveyed a database of more than 220,000 healthcare professionals in September 2020. Some recipients had been placed by LocumTenens.com, and some had not. There was a total of 2,080 respondents, both physicians and advanced practitioners, who were self-selected and spanned all 50 states.
